The Gospel and Prayer

Going through the motions without knowing the reason for them or without love to motivate them is a surefire way to rob our lives of joy and lead to ineffectiveness. We see the centrality of love even in God sending Jesus to Earth in John 3:16. The famous "Love Chapter" 1 Corinthians 13 starts out by telling us that even great acts done for God turn to "noisy clatter" when not done in love. Let's pray that God would continue to renew our love for Him and each other and that it would be the driving force empowering everything that we do.
