- 4. Have you ever experienced any level of persecution? How do you think you would react to persecution like what is described in this text?

5.	How does the end of verse 10 and verse 11 give the "good news" as a follow- up to the bad news?
6.	What is the main thing John is trying to teach us in these verses?
